SOCK BUNNIES


Turn some unwanted socks into these funky bunnies. The children can make them as crazy as they like!

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STORE CUPBOARD

LEARNING ZONE: Art & Design

- Socks
- Fabric scissors
- 300-400g rice or dried lentils
- Thin ribbon, strong thread or elastic bands
- Wide ribbon
- Scraps of felt
- Double-sided tape or glue
- Thin thread



2 Fill the sock with more rice for the head. Make it a bit smaller than the body, then tie it in the same way so the rice won't spill out.

3 Cut down the top part of the sock to make two pieces for the ears. Shape the ears by cutting each piece into a curve with a point at the end. If the ears are too long (depending on the size of the sock) cut them down in size.

4. Cut out the eyes, nose, mouth and teeth from felt. Stick them onto the bunny's head with thin thread for whiskers.

HINTS & TIPS

Use fabric scissors to cut the ears, an adult will need to help with this.

It's quicker to stick fabric with double-sided tape, rather than waiting for glue to dry

Trim off elasticated tops from socks; these can be stretched around the bunny as extra decoration.

5 Tie a thicker piece of ribbon in a bow around the bunny's neck or around the middle into a bow.
